To complete the major, a minimum of 6 credit hours of accounting and financial management electives must be completed (all 6 hours must be completed through Hiram College). Students may only count one pass/fail course toward their elective hours, and at least 3 credit hours of coursework must be at the 30000-level. Additional electives may be added to the curriculum, and internships performed for academic credit can also count towards the 6 credit hours needed. Electives should be chosen in consultation with an advisor in the program and may focus on a specific career path including

1. preparation for the CPA examination, graduate school, and/or a public accounting career,
2. industry and managerial accounting, and
3. finance.

Recent graduates in accounting and financial management have found employment in top tier and regional public accounting firms, in governmental and non-profit organizations and in a number of public and private institutions as financial analysts, financial planners, auditors, cost accountants and tax accountants. Many of our students have also continued their studies in Master of Accountancy programs to prepare to become Certified Public Accountants. Hiram's accounting program has cooperative agreements with Case Western Reserve University, Ohio Northern University, Bowling Green State University, and Baldwin Wallace University to accept qualified Hiram accounting major graduates into their Master of Accountancy programs.
